# Subs Allowed		U11 & U12 - Unlimited subs. U13 - U19 - Max of 7 subs per half. Players may not re-enter in the same half. If concussion is suspected, the player may be substituted without counting towards the 7 subs.																				
Substitutions		Any stoppage at referee's discretion. Substitutions should be recorded by each referee. Substitutes should hand their passcard to AR1 prior to game entry. Passcards are returned to each team at the half and at the end of the game.																				

Report Score	Yes	Record goal scorers, first half goals, second half goals and final score. The home team should provide an ECNL Match Report to the referee. At the conclusion of the game, after the match report has been completed and signed by the referee, the referee should give the game report back to the home team. The home team is responsible for uploading the match report.
Report for Yellow cards	Yes	Note yellows on score sheet
Report for Serious Injury	Yes	Note injury on score sheet
Report for Red Cards	Yes	The referee reports all red cards with corresponding documentation immediately following the game to the assignor, who will then forward it to the TSRA President. The report should include age group, teams, player(s) sent off, the offense, and referee's name, email and phone number. Referees should not keep player passes for players that are sent off, they should be returned to the team manager.
